CLASS GUIDELINES

All Friesian classes will be run under IFSHA rules and regulations. Please refer to www.friesianshowhorse.com.
All Andalusian classes will be run under IALHA rules and regulations.

*A lack of proper tack, equipment or appointments shall result in immediate disqualification in any class.

Junior Exhibitors are defined as -

An individual who has not reached his 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year. The age of an individual on Dec. 1st will be maintained throughout the entire competition year. Persons born on Dec. 1st assumed the greater age on that date. Junior Exhibitors are not allowed to exhibit stallions.

Novice Rider is defined as -

Any rider who has not won more than 3 blue ribbons at any competition. The status shall be determined as of the closing date of the entries for this competition. Novice Riders are not allowed to exhibit stallions.

Novice Horse is defined as -

Any horse who has not won more than 3 blue ribbons at any competition. The status shall be determined as of the closing date of the entries for this competition.

1-17. In-Hand classes:

All horses shall enter the ring along the near rail, counterclockwise at a trot, single file, well spaced. Continue along the rail to the far side. Each horse shall be called to the judge by the ringmaster. Presented in hand. Then follow the judges directions.

18 & 19. Best Movement -

Horses are to be shown in-hand as they would in a halter class. To be shown at a four beat walk and animated trot with emphasis on extension. Judged on movement only.

21. Amateur Handler In-Hand:

To be shown by an amateur. Follow the guidelines of the above In-Hand class. Absolutely NO stallions! ?THIS CLASS IS A MANDATORY QUALIFIER FOR THE WALK -TROT HIGH POINT AWARD.?

Road Hack:

To be shown with a reasonably loose rein at the walk, trot, extended trot, canter and hand gallop; at the discretion of the judge, horses while on the rail may be asked to halt and rein back at any time. To be judged on manners, performance, and substance.

66. Road Hack Championship:

Specifications same as for Road Hack. To be eligible horses must have been entered, shown and judged in Road Hack.

36. Open English Junior Exhibitor:

Any eligible breed may enter. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter. May be asked to back.

37. Andalusian English Pleasure Saddleseat, Open:

Horses will be judged on performance, manners, type, quality and conformation at the walk, trot and canter.

38. Open Hunter Hack:

Any eligible breed may enter. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter. A hand gallop may be asked for. Horses are required to jump 2 obstacles, not to exceed 2'6".

39. Half-Andalusian English Pleasure, Saddleseat:

Horses will be judged on performance, manners, type, quality and conformation at the walk, trot and canter.

40. Half-Andalusian English Pleasure, Huntseat

Judged on performance, manners, type quality and conformation at the walk, trot and canter.

41. Concours D'Elegance:

The essence of the class is the word "elegance". The winner will be the turnout which in the opinion of the judge presents the most elegant effect. This will include vehicle, harness, appointments, horses, driver, passengers, grooms, etc. but above all general impression is most important. Vehicle and harness will be inspected to insure thoughtful restoration, cleanliness and maintenance. Attention will be paid to personal appearance of the driver, grooms and passengers as it contributes to the overall picture. Period costumes are prohibited. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the turnout.

42. Andalusian English Pleasure Saddleseat, Amateur:

Judged on manners, performance, type, quality and conformation at the walk, trot and canter.

43. Half-Andalusian Western Pleasure:

Judged on performance, manners, type, quality and conformation at the walk, trot and lope.

44. Open English Pleasure:

Any eligible breed may enter. May be shown dressage, huntseat or saddleseat. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Extended trot may be asked for at the discretion of the judge. May be asked to back.

45. Junior Exhibitor Walk & Trot:

Judged on the exhibitors performance at the walk and trot as well as the suitability of the mount to the rider.

46. Andalusian English Pleasure Saddleseat, Junior Horse(3 & 4 year olds):

Judged on quality, type, performance, conformation and manners at the walk, trot and canter.

47. Half-Andalusian Driving:

Judged on performance, quality, manners and type. The horse is to give a brilliant performance with style, presence, finish, balance and cadence at a walk, trot and strong trot.

48. Open Pleasure, Novice Horse:

Horse may not have won more than 3 blue ribbons. May be shown english or western. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter or lope.

49. Andalusian Country English Pleasure Saddleseat, Open:

Judged on attitude, manners, performance, type, quality and conformation at the walk, trot, strong trot, canter and hand gallop.

50. Half-Andalusian Dressage Suitability:

Horses are judged on gaits, type and correctness and manners consistent with USDF and USAE rules. Horses which have competed above First level dressage are not eligible to compete.

51. Junior Pleasure Horse, Open:

Horse must be 5 years of age or younger. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter. May be asked to back.

52. Andalusian Country English Pleasure Saddleseat, Amateur

Judged on manners, performance, type, attitude, quality and conformation at the walk, trot, strong trot, canter and hand gallop.

53. Open Leadline:

Open to any competitor. Youth or Adult. May be shown english or western. To be shown at the walk and trot.

54 - 56. Fun Classes

57 - 65. Championship In-Hand classes : Refer to rules for qualifying classes 1 - 31.

67. Open Carriage Driving:

To be shown in a suitable carriage and harness. No wire wheels permitted unless antique. Judged on the quality of the walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot.

68. Novice Rider Walk Trot: Youth & Adult:

Open to any exhibitor who has not won more than 3 blue ribbons. May not cross enter in classes requiring canter. Judged on riders ability at the walk and trot.

69. Andalusian Country English Pleasure Saddleseat, Junior Horse:
